Re: Inogen FAA Attestation Letter

To Whom It May Concern:

The FAA has changed their method of certifying portable oxygen concentrators. Originally, the FAA would test every POC to confirm whether they were approved to take and use aboard airplanes.

Now, the FAA requires a self certification. This means the FAA sets a list of criteria for testing and product specifications that the manufacturer of a portable oxygen concentrator is required to meet in order to self certify for FAA approval.

Inogen meets all of these requirements and as such is legally allowed to certify their products as FAA approved. Thus, they have the FAA icon on the label of each POC.

The Inogen letter of FAA Attestation states their devices conform to all applicable FAA acceptance criteria for POC carriage and use on board aircraft.
